

BENNION REUNION SET FOR AUGUST 18

The Bennion Family Reunion will be held Saturday August 18, 1990 at the Taylorsville LDS Stake Center, 1365 West 4800 South in Salt Lake City, from 4:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. or whenever.

Exciting activities and exhibits are planned, including extensive Bennion pioneer memorabilia. 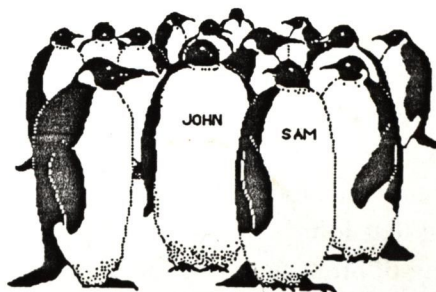

Pioneer Bennion Memorial Opportunity

Pioneer Trail State Park, which is located at the mouth of Emigration Canyon in Salt Lake City and contains the famous "This is the Place" monument to Brigham Young and the pioneers, is interested in having a Bennion Log Home placed in the Park. This opportunity is a result of our initiative in pursuing the possibilities.

The Park has a small collection of original homes that date from the 1840's and 1850's, but experience has shown that the actual original homes are far too expensive to move, reconstruct, and maintain. Original logs are rotting with the assistance of termites, and original adobe is disintegrating. Replacement adobe is being eaten by birds, so it appears that some of the old pioneer skills have been lost!

In lieu of working with actual original homes, the Park is trying a new approach. Replicated homes may be built of new materials if a reasonable case can be made for design authenticity.

The Bennion Family Executive Committee would like to explore the possibility of having a replica of an early home of Samuel and/or John Bennion constructed at the Park. In order to present a proposal to the Park, we need any information about Samuel and John's early homes, including the dugouts. The Park covers the period from 1847 to 1869.

You have no doubt read in Bennion literature of the brothers' original two story house near what is today Pioneer Park. This log structure was dismantled and moved twice and then divided into two one-story home for both Samuel and John. One description indicated that John's part was "long". That beginning tidbit needs to be joined by dozens of others in order to come up with an authenti-

cated design that can be proposed to the Park.

At the reunion we will have audio and video recorders and cameras available to record your recollections or make copies of any photos you may have which may help us in this investigation. Any material you bring to the reunion to share with us may be taken home with you.

If we can come up with an acceptable proposal, the Park will cover virtually all the costs and will own and control the use of the structure. Hosts at the house will disseminate information about the house and the families which lived in it (or one like it!). They will gladly accept any original Bennion furnishings, which would make wonderful enhancements to the exhibit.

The necessary ingredients for a successful project are authentic descriptions of the original home, our strong interest, some furnishings from the period, and some seed money. Your Executive Committee feels that this would be an appropriate and lasting way to memorialize the contributions Samuel and John and their families made to the culture of Utah. It would be an exciting place to visit with all future generations of Bennions.

If the project proves feasible and valuable, its completion would be targeted for the 1996 State Centennial or the 1997 Pioneer Sesquicentennial, or more quickly if possible.

NEARING PUBLICATION!!

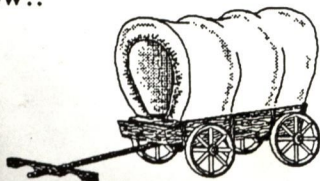
Bennion Family Volume 4: History of John Bennion

Our family historian, Ruth W. Rogers, is nearing completion of Bennion Family Volume 4: History of John Bennion. She recently concluded her years of research, having gathered and organized all available information relating to John and his three wives, Esther Wainwright, Esther Ann Birch, and Mary Turpin. Based upon the research data, she relates the story of the three families in an historical narrative style.

In addition to the historical narrative, the book contains 74 photographs of people and places important to the lives of John, his wives and children. Also included are all known letters involving John and his wives, of which there are approximately 150, most of which have never been published, and John's previously unpublished journal of his mission to the Muddy River area of Nevada.

The combination of narrative plus historical documentation gives the reader both an understandable chronological flow and access to the source information.

The book will be about 200 pages long, pages 8 1/2" by 11", and hard-bound in an attractive blue cover with silver lettering. The manuscript will be on display at the reunion, then given to the printer shortly thereafter. The book may be ordered at the reunion or by using the order form at the back of this newsletter. The pre-publication price is \$10 if picked up in Salt Lake City or Provo, and \$12 if mailed. After September 30, these prices will increase to \$15 and \$17. ANOTHER FAMILY GROUP SHEET AVAILABLE

If you are keeping track (you should be!), the Bennion Family Executive Committee, via this publication, is trying to publish updated and fully documented family groups sheets on the ancestors of Samuel and John Bennion. In earlier issues we published the group sheets of their parents and grandparents, and with this issue we are releasing the first group sheet of their great-grandparents: the family of John Bennion and Ann Griffith.

There are a few comments that need to be made. Our research has discovered that many of our ancestors have been baptized, endowed, and/or sealed as many as 8 times! As I have examined the duplicate ordinance work, I've noticed that much of the duplication stems from incorrect dates and alternative spellings. When someone turns in a name with slightly different date or spelling, it is virtually impossible to catch it as a duplication unless one is extremely familiar with that particular family.

This duplication is unfortunate because we understand the efforts and sacrifice required to get this work done, and it's a shame that some of it is wasted. With the advent of personal computers for researchers and the development of a Church-wide database, we hope to eliminate the duplication and make research more efficient.

On the accompanying family group sheet (and future ones as well) we have adopted a convention which has been recommended by the Church: for a particular ordinance, use the earliest date which can be accurately documented. We have done this, but it occasionally results in a baptism date being after an endowment date, which could generate some

Taylorsville Cemetery Eagle Scout Project

Dear Bennion Family,

Hi! My name is Richard Bennion and I am working on my eagle project this summer. My eagle project is being done at the Taylorsville Cemetery in Salt Lake City. The cemetery has not been maintained for 50 years, so it needs significant work. My eagle project consists of about 100 Bennion graves. We are going to clean and straighten all of the headstones. Some of the larger headstones have become disconnected from their bases, so we will be gluing them back onto their bases by using construction glue and silicon guns. We will also level out the ground and prepare the ground to be seeded, which will happen in September.

Attached to this letter is a list of the 130 Bennions who are buried in the Taylorsville Cemetery, organized by how they fit on the family tree. I made this list by going over all the records of the Cemetery and comparing them to our Bennion Family Volume 2 book. Please read the list and see which of your relatives are there. Incidentally, I learned that the Taylorsville Cemetery is also the original location of Samuel and John Bennion's "Old Fort" homes when they first moved out to that area.

I am asking each of you for a donation that will help with buying the supplies and equipment needed for this project. Any extra funds will be used to buy shrubs for the cemetery. Please make out the checks to "Restore the Pride", which is a trust fund set up by the Cemetery. It is a non-profit organization and your donation is tax-deductible. This John Bennion has often been confused with a person named "Johannes fil Johannes Baneon de Bannel", who appears on the Hawarden Parish Records dated 31 March 1719 (G.S. Film #944,003). This confusion may stem from the fact that Samuel Bennion performed temple work for this person in the St. George Temple in 1882. In any event, Howard S. Bennion did careful research on this subject and concluded that "Johannes fil Johannes Baneon de Bannel" is not our ancestor because Bannel is another township, different from Mancot, where our other Bennion ancestors were located. The other evidence that this "Johannes" is not our ancestor is the structure and dates of the family of John Bennion (b. 1690) and Susannah Baxter (b. 1692) who had several children named John who died in infancy or childhood. For more details on this subject, the researcher is referred to Helen Madsen and to the journals of Howard S. Bennion written in 1937, copies of which are in Helen's possession.

Christening: 8 Aug 1723, Capenhurst, Shotwick, Chester, England. By Correspondence from a researcher in Chester, England, to Howard S. Bennion.

Marriage: G.S. Film #275,781, Page 105, Hawarden Parish Records.

Death: "Walked out of home and was never seen again - about 1744. Ill fortune fell upon him." (Notes made by John Bennion (b. 1820) on his genealogical trip to England in 1872).

Baptism: G.S. Film #445,745. This is the earliest baptismal date which used John's correct birth (christening) date. Earlier baptisms used the incorrect dates associated with "Johannes" as described above.

Endowment: G.S. Film #445,745. See explanation under "Baptism".

Sealing to spouse: G.S. Film #170,597 SG, Page 410, #11063. Even though this entry lists John as 1719, Flint, North Wales, the wife, Ann Griffith, is listed by her full name, and the couple is clearly identified. The sealing is valid on this date.

Sealing to parents: G.S. Film #456,696 SL.

Several references to work done for this ancestor list her as "Ann", "Ann or Mary", or "Mary" Griffith. Her birth lists "Ann", her marriage lists "Ann", and her death lists "Ann", so we have discounted all "Mary" entries as not necessary. (18 Feb 1990)

Christening: G.S. Film #104,781 Flint Mt, Hawarden Parish Records.

Burial: G.S. Film #944,003 Hawarden Parish Records. The burial entry in the Hawarden Parish Records reads as follows: "Ann-wife of John Bannion Mancott."

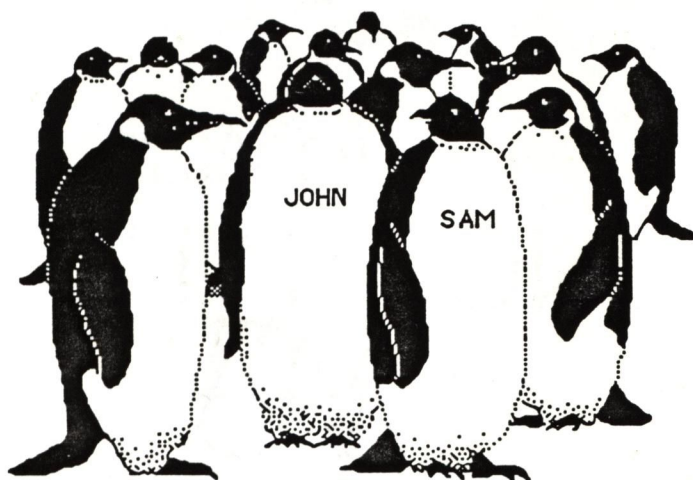
