

SAMUEL R. BENNION'S SHEEP WAGON FOUND, BEING RESTORED

*To Be Located At
Pioneer Trails State Park*

The sheep wagon of Samuel R. Bennion, the eldest son of John Bennion and Esther Wainwright, has recently been located and is in the process of being restored to its original condition. It will be on permanent display at the Pioneer Trails State Park in Salt Lake City, where the "This is The Place" Monument is located at the mouth of Emigration Canyon.

Your Bennion Family Executive Committee received a phone call a few months ago from Mike Shurtleff, a third great grandson of Samuel Bennion and Mary Bushell via their son Hyrum and his daughter Mary Eliza. Mike is a volunteer worker at the Pioneer Trails State Park, and he informed us of the wagon's existence.

Here is the wagon's "genealogy" as best we know it: The wagon was apparently constructed between 1867 and 1870 by Samuel R. Bennion, who was 25 to 28 years old at the time. S.R. originally used the wagon in Rush Valley, and then he took it with him to Vernal when he moved there. Samuel R. used the wagon until his retirement in 1906, at which time he divided his livestock holdings among his sons. Samuel R.'s foreman, Alfred Powell, received the wagon at that time as payment for his services. The wagon continued in use for many years until

the death of Alfred Powell in the 1960's. Sometime during the 1960's, it suffered damage from a stove fire inside the wagon, and was repaired with plywood. However, the original frame and hardware were not damaged by the fire. In 1972, Alfred's widow sold it to Mr. & Mrs. Warren D. Richardson, close friends who did not want to see the old wagon be lost. The Richardsons continued to use the wagon for shepherding and hunting until Warren's death in 1987. His widow retained possession of it in Vernal until this year, when she donated it to the Pioneer Trails State Park.

"Cousin" Mike Shurtleff tells us that the Park is thrilled to obtain a wagon whose ownership and authenticity is so well documented. The restoration is currently taking place at the Pioneer Trails State Park, and it is expected to be ready for exhibition within the next month. As Mike was researching the wagon, he went to the public library to see what he could find concerning sheep wagons. In a 1978 issue of the *Utah History Magazine*, he found some drawings of a sheep wagon done by a Lee Udall Bennion. [Unfortunately we cannot locate Lee Udall Bennion in our Bennion Family Vol. 2 book.] The drawings

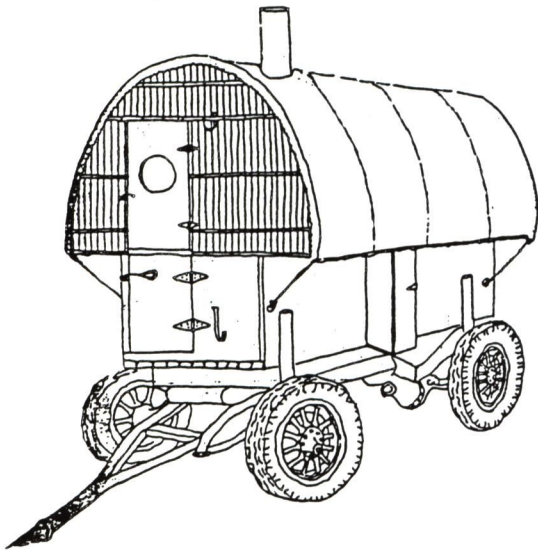
are reproduced below. According to the curator at the Pioneer Trails State Park, the restoration of S.R.'s wagon is being done partly according to the drawings, and mostly according to their knowledge of sheep wagons of that time period. Over the years, S.R.'s wagon received rubber tires and a hard top, but it is being restored with original style wheels and a canvas top. The state owns another sheep wagon which dates back to 1862, so they are quite capable of restoring S.R.'s to its original style.

These two sheep wagons are historically significant because they are the only two known to pre-date some Wyoming sheep wagons which had previously claimed to

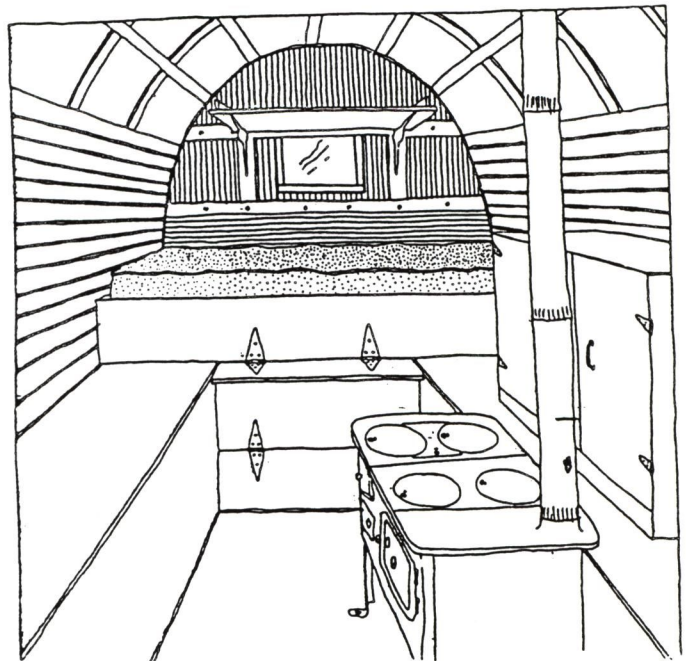
be the oldest in the west. They help prove that Rocky Mountain sheep herding originated in Utah with the pioneers, not in Wyoming!

The Bennion Family Association, of which you are a member, donated approximately \$180 to pay for the canvas cover being installed as part of the restoration. We have been assured that we can borrow the wagon for next summer's Bennion Family Reunion!

S. O. BENNION: UTAH NEWSPAPER HALL OF FAME

[In 1966 Samuel O. Bennion was inducted into The Utah Newspaper Hall of Fame. The following article was published in brochure form at that time.]

During the 1930's throngs of viewers watching Salt Lake City's huge "Days of '47" parades would wave and call cheery greetings to a familiar figure as he rode back and forth over the route seated on the box of a policeman's motorcycle.

Samuel O. Bennion was the grand marshal of the parade and the publisher of The Deseret News, one of Salt Lake City's daily papers. He was performing another of his many community services with the zeal that had marked his long, prominent career.

Samuel Otis Bennion put his whole heart and soul in all that he did, whether it was directing the parade, publishing his newspaper, helping to direct the Chamber of Commerce, Church service, or carrying on his ranch and agricultural activities. He was that type of individual, with a great zest for living and a keen interest in all that went on about him. He had his finger in many community enterprises and was prominent in civic and religious circles.

The friends of S. O. Bennion were legion. He numbered among them people from all walks of life and in many businesses, civic and religious enterprises. Though many of them were not of the same religion as he, they respected him for his high principles and ideals and for his industry and initiative.

He was born in Taylorsville, Utah, on June 9, 1874 of pioneer parentage. His father, John Rowland Bennion [*Samuel's oldest son*] came to the Salt Lake Valley in 1847 as a boy of seven years.

S. O. Bennion spent his boyhood in the atmosphere of pioneering and became early identified with sheep ranching and farming. He early gained a position of prominence in

the agricultural life of the intermountain country. He retained these interests throughout his entire life.

In 1904 he was called as a missionary for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. It was this mission call which eventually launched him into the publishing business and started a career of Church service which brought him recognition as one of the General Authorities of his Church.

His mission call was to the Central States with headquarters in Independence, Mo. Called initially for a two or three year mission, he stayed for 27 years. From 1906 until 1932 he was mission president. In this capacity he also served for these many years as manager of the Zion's Printing and Publishing Company of Independence. In addition to printing and editing much of the Church's mission literature, this firm also published under his direction a monthly missionary magazine called the Liahona.

S. O. Bennion was called as a member of the First Council of Seventy of the LDS Church in 1932. This brought him back to Salt Lake City to make his home, and the next year, 1933, he became vice-president and general manager of The Deseret News. This moved him into a position of real community responsibility in an important assignment commanding the respect of his associates in the publishing business.

During most of this period, he was active as a director and on committee assignments in the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce. In addition to his being one of the leading figures in the Days of '47 activities he extended his attention to honoring Utah's pioneers as a prominent member of the Utah Pioneer Trails and Landmarks Association.

S. O. Bennion married Charlotte Towler on Aug. 23, 1898. They were the parents of two children. His companion stayed at his side

with her loyal support during his long missionary career and his later Church assignment, which brought him new responsibilities. He traveled widely throughout the country in this assignment.

It was during his service as general manager of The Deseret News that the paper installed its great modern Hoe press, capable at that time of printing 120,000 twenty-page papers an hour. When this press was inaugurated in September, 1936, it was one of the printing marvels of the intermountain country. There was nothing finer. To S. O. Bennion there was nothing too good for the paper he managed as it served the great western country.

The noted Utah publisher was released from his Deseret News assignment in August, 1941, to allow him to devote his attention more fully to his calling as a General Authority of the Church and to aid in its greatly

expanding missionary service.

Death came, like S. O. Bennion would like it to have come — when he was in full service and activity. He had attended quarterly conference in Pasadena, Calif., on Saturday and Sunday, and then returned home where he passed away on Wednesday, May 8, 1945 of a heart attack.

The Deseret News said of him editorially at the time of his death:

“He maintained the keenest possible interest in things as they happened around him and injected, definitely, his personality into those events which came under his influence.

“He was at home in the saddle, on the plow, in a swivel chair, or in the pulpit and in all these capacities he was a success.

“He put his heart and soul into all he did and it was no wonder that his heart finally wore out, for he gave it all to other people.”

ANOTHER BRANCH ON THE FAMILY TREE

In this edition of the Bennion Family Recorder we are pleased to provide the “Iball” branch of the Bennion Family Tree. Assuming that you are following along in the various issues of this publication, Elizabeth Iball (person #1 on this issue's pedigree chart) is the same as person #3 in the pedigree chart found in the December 1990 issue of the Recorder, which is also the same as person #5 in the pedigree chart found in the March 1989 Recorder.

We are enclosing the family group sheets and documentation for all families found on the attached pedigree chart. The family group sheet for Elizabeth and her husband William Bennion was published in the June 1989 Recorder, so we have not included that one.

If you note any mistakes or have any additional information pertaining to any of these group sheets, please contact Helen Madsen, our family genealogical coordinator. We believe that we are making progress

toward efficient use of our resources — minimizing duplicate efforts, and sharing whatever progress is made.

Many of our ancestors have received their ordinances multiple times, but we use the earliest documented ordinance dates we can find. This explains how an endowment date can precede a baptism date, for example. We have not included documentation for duplicate ordinance work.

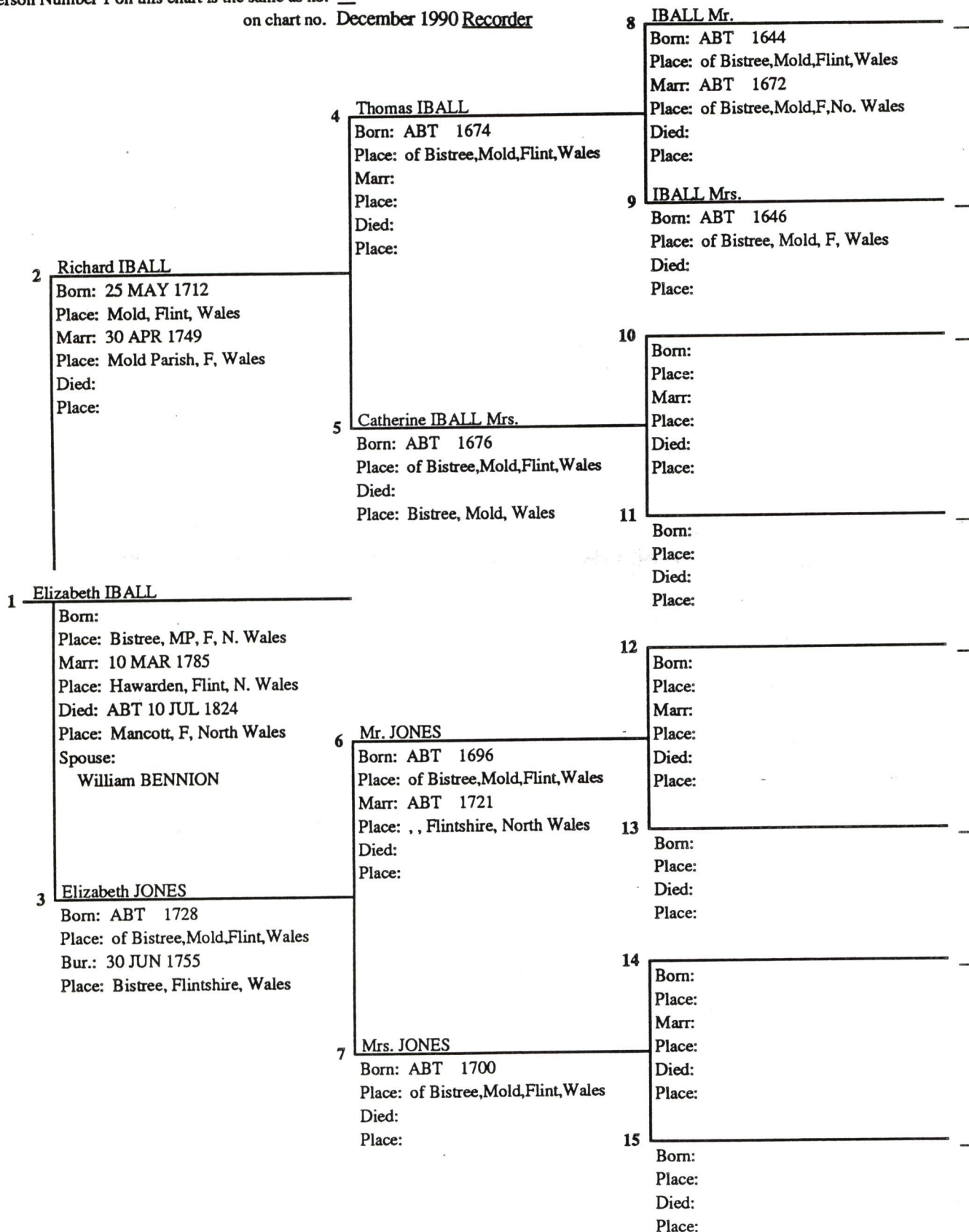

daughter of Richard or Rhys. However, based on careful analysis of available records (1991), we have concluded that there is a higher probability that she (William Bennion's wife) is the daughter of Richard. As computers don't deal well with ambiguities, we have selected Richard & Elizabeth for the family tree. In any case, the temple work has been completed for both possibilities. The dates documented here assume that William Bennion married the daughter of Richard, not Rhys.
