The challenge is to get the information about those who have joined the family in the 30 years since the original Volume 2 was published, correct the mistakes, and add the descendants of John & Elizabeth's daughters. ... The format will be very similar to the last book. We need the dates and places of births, marriages, and deaths for every descendant and spouse. We also need the names of the parents of the non-family spouses. We are planning to include current addresses and phone numbers unless specifically requested otherwise.

The necessary information can be gathered in many ways but we suggest a computer to avoid re-typing and mistakes. Those who use a computer with the PAF program can send PAF GEDCOM files or PAF data files to the person in their family who is responsible for the next higher level, or directly to me. Either IBM-compatible or Macintosh computers are OK. Those who do not use computers can send them to their family branch representative.

Those who have already collected data can send it to me and I will produce a draft copy of your data for your review. This helps

June 15: list of volunteers completed

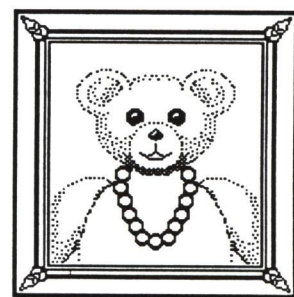
Sept 15: draft copy produced

## NATIVE UTAHN'S BOOK ON CARING IS AN INSPIRATION

Val J. Halamandaris, a native Utahn with a Greek heritage, says his "miraculous jump from Carbon High School in Price, Utah, to a job at the U.S. Senate amazed everyone except Grandmother and a few surviving old women in black who took the opportunity to tell everyone that the tea leaves never lie."

In Washington, he studied law and worked for Senator Frank E. Moss and Rep. Claude Pepper on matters relating to aging. After he left government, two things inspired him to write a book about caring people. In 1987, he met Norman Cousins and told him how much he admired his book "Human Options," which featured questions put to famous people about the most important lessons they had learned in their lifetimes.

Halamandaris and Cousins talked about caring human beings who exemplified the golden rule, and about the Halamandaris brothers' efforts to create The Caring Institute to help society "to change its values from selfishness and materialism to community cooperation and service to others."

In 1988, Halamandaris' father died. The sons, Val and Bill, found that he had kept scrapbooks in which he had neatly pasted thousands of quotations, all with the central theme of caring. "We took that as proof positive that the apple never falls very far from the tree, and that what we become as adults is profoundly influenced by examples we see in our parents."

So Halamandaris set out to identify the 100 most caring people in history and distil their thoughts to 700 words each, so that any reader could quickly benefit. The finished product, just published in a large, attractive

paperback, includes a full-page photograph of each person selected.

It is a classy pantheon of diverse people drawn from every era of history. They range from Moses, Buddha, Confucius, Socrates, Plato and Aristotle to Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, Ralph Waldo Emerson and Leo Tolstoy. There are fewer women than men, partly because women have not been as faithfully recorded by history as men.

But such notable women as Clara Barton, Florence Nightingale, Sojourner Truth, Ella Wheeler Wilcox, Helen Keller, Eleanor Roosevelt, Millicent Fenwick, Elisabeth Kubler-Ross and Mother Teresa appear in the volume.

Joseph Campbell, Albert Einstein and Norman Vincent Peale are included. There are some recent political figures, such as Franklin D. Roosevelt, Hubert Humphrey, Jimmy Carter, and Halamandaris' mentors — Pepper and Moss.

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, Erich Fromm and Mahatma Gandhi appear. There are also a few surprises, such as 20/20's Hugh Downs, the only one I find questionable. As a rather bland television personality with a meager history of caring, he is in fast company here.

Most interesting to Utahns is the inclusion of **Lowell Bennion**, noted humanitarian, author and teacher, who is quoted as saying, "the basic human values are love and integrity. If you have these two values, you have all the ethical virtues of life." Since Bennion has vividly taught in his university classes the ideas and values of Confucius, Buddha, Plato and others, it seems especially appropriate that he would be classified as a peer.

This handsome, superbly executed book, called "Faces of Caring," is one everyone should own. It is available from Caring Publishing, 519 C Street, NE, Washington, D.C. 20002-5809 for \$30. It is well worth the

# 9 Things You Can Do For The Bennion Family Association

Ask not what the Bennion Family Association can do for you, but ask what you can do for the Bennion Family Association! The Executive Committee spends a great deal of time organizing and working to further the objectives of the Association, but the great strength and future of this group can only be fully realized by the participation of all its members.

You, as an individual, can participate in reaching the objectives of the Bennion Family Association (BFA) by doing any one or more of the following:

1. **PAF SOFTWARE** Buy or get access to PAF (church family history software). Don't be afraid of computers; once the program is set up, anyone can learn to use it. Also, your children can help you.

2. **LEARN PAF** Take the family history class during Sunday School or have someone teach you PAF. Research your own family line while using the Recorder for the Bennion/Roberts lines.

3. **BUY PAF DISK** Buy a computer disk from the BFA (see back page of this issue) for \$5.00 which has the Bennion Family history line on it. You need to tell us if you need a 5 1/4" floppy disk or a 3 1/2" diskette, and if you want IBM or Macintosh format. Steven Bennion, our computer expert *non-pareil*, will include instructions on how to put this genealogy information on your computer.

4. **VOLUNTEER TO HELP** Sign up to be a volunteer to update the Bennion Family of Utah, Vol. 2. You will use PAF to accumulate information, correct it, and update new descendants (births, marriages, deaths, etc.). You don't have to be a "whiz" and any help is appreciated. See the December 1992 Recorder for details.

5. **TEMPLE WORK** Be a proxy for temple work for your personal ancestors. Go to the Salt Lake Temple and at the "Family File Desk" say "I would like to do an endowment (initiations) for anyone in the

Helen Madsen file". If you're out of state, call Helen on how to do temple work in your area.

6. **YOUR FAMILY HISTORY** Write down your own family history including earliest remembrances, education, profession, births, deaths, feelings, church positions, hard times, spiritual experiences, values, etc.

7. **EXTENDED FAMILY HISTORY** Search out histories or journals of your ancestors and compile them in a single location. Interview your parents or grandparents on video or cassette tape. Tell the Bennion Family Association what you find and we'll maintain a central index of Bennion journals.

8. **FAMILY REUNIONS** Organize a family reunion for your grandparents or great grandparents. You can include food, games, books & genealogical information, histories, newsletters, past photos, mementos, group photos, talent show, t-shirts, etc.

9. **MONEY** Donate money to help pay for research, books, and this publication. See the donation line on the back page of this issue.

We encourage each of you to do at least one of these nine things before the next Recorder appears on your doorstep in about three months. Take a family home evening, get organized, do something, and send in your experiences to the editor so we can share them in the Recorder!

## Family History Mystery

In doing research for my forthcoming biography of Samuel Bennion, I have discovered some interesting and perplexing legal documents relating to the handling of Samuel's estate following his death. Below is a brief summary of what I have found, plus a plea for help! If any of you have knowledge of the legal proceedings regarding settlement of estates, please contact me!

It appears that settling Samuel's estate took several years and may have been complicated by the fact that Samuel had two families (plural marriage). Of particular interest are recently discovered records regarding Rhoda Jones Bennion and her sons Wilford and Arthur.

When Samuel died in 1889, Wilford was 19 years old and Arthur was 8. Rhoda filed a petition to be declared "guardian" of her two sons. The court then apportioned to Rhoda money from Samuel's estate for Rhoda, the boys, and the upkeep of their farm. Over the next several years, Rhoda and the boys filed annual accountings with the court, inventorying their personal estates and accounting for the past year's expenses each time. The estate values fluctuated between \$2,000 and \$5,000. When Wilford married in 1891, he ceased to be included in the court documents, and similarly for Arthur when he married in 1900. It appears that as each boy married, Rhoda's "guardianship" ceased. No further documents were filed until Rhoda's death in 1914, when both Wilford and Arthur appeared in court and signed receipts for their portions of what Rhoda left. At this point the books were finally closed on Samuel Bennion's estate.

These documents raise all kinds of interesting questions — Why would a mother petition for guardianship of her own children? Were these types of proceedings typical of those days throughout the U.S., or were they unique to territories, or to Utah? When were these laws established, by whom, and why? As the battle between the LDS Church and the U.S. was peaking at this time, were these proceedings a form of harassment? Have the laws changed? If so, when and why?

If you can shed any light on these subjects, I'd love to hear from you!!

## William & Mary Wilson Bennion Book

*We have recently received notification that the descendants of William Bennion and his wife Mary Wilson will be publishing a book on their illustrious progenitors. Here are the details from Colleen Bennion:*

"The book we will be publishing on William & Mary Wilson Bennion consists of: • 6 journals covering from 1896 to 1914 (2 missionary journals, 2 everyday journals by William, 2 of Mary's journals); • a book of poems and thoughts; • histories of each of their sons (William Ellis, Theron, La-Mont, and Burdette); • pictures from the family photograph album; • histories of each of the grand-children of William and Mary; • histories of William's parents and Mary's parents; • the genealogy of all of their descendants.

"The book is about 600 pages in length. We will have only one printing of the book and therefore if anyone would be interested in purchasing a book we feel that we need a firm order or an order paid in advance of the publishing of the book. Right now our estimated cost is running about \$24 per book.

"After the book is published we plan to turn the journals into the Church History Department in the Bennion File. We feel that they will be better cared for by the Church than anyone else."
