Be a Part of History in the Making

Anniversary: On October 5, 1847 Samuel and John Bennion entered the Salt Lake Valley. On the 150th anniversary of their arrival, the Bennion Family Association will hold a brief Fireside to dedicate a public commemorative monument in their honor on the banks of the Jordan River near their homesites. (See mock-up of the 2'x3' monument plaque on the following page). The monument stands along the jogging trail in Arrowhead Park, which is part of the Provo-Jordan River Parkway near 4800 South.

Memorial: This beautiful memorial has been funded by the Bennion Family Association, and the monument site has been provided by Murray City. We owe a special thanks to Gerry Summerhays who has done much of the work in making this memorial possible.

Fireside: The Fireside will be held at the Taylorsville meetinghouse near the Bennion brothers homesites at 6:00 p.m. Speakers at the fireside will be Gerry Summerhays and Elder Richard P. Lindsay. After their remarks, we will journey by foot or carpool to the monument site, about ½ mile down the road from the meetinghouse.

Historical Moment: This will be the last Reunion to which all 40,000 descendants of Samuel and John Bennion will be invited. Hereafter, the Bennion Family Association encourages families to gather in "Grandfather" family reunions. The Bennion Family Association will continue to promote genealogical research and disseminate family history information.

Web Site: In the near future, the Bennion Family Association is planning to host a web site on the Internet. This will give family members easier access to resources and family history information. 

BENNION BROTHERS

Looking west across the river you view the homesteads of the Bennion brothers. They arrived in the Salt Lake Valley in October of 1847, and in January of 1849 were among the first pioneers to settle "Over Jordan." Their homes were located west of the Jordan River, south of what is now 4800 South. They and their descendants have been influential in the L.D.S. Church, government, education, business, agriculture and industry.


